

#### **Helpful Hints**

We all know that we must clean our dryer lint trap before each load to prevent fire. However, if you use dryer sheets regularly, did you know that there's another step that you must take? Run the lint trap under water after removing the lint. Does the water run through the screen, or does it puddle up? If the screen is blocked, clean it with a brush and hot soapy water. The built-up residue from the dryer sheets that is causing the puddle is also preventing proper air flow in the dryer and is a potential cause of fire. Connie Stackhouse

### **Featured Recipe**

#### **CARMELITA BARS**

Ingredients 1 cup flour

1 cup flour1/4 tsp salt1/2 tsp baking soda3/4 cup brown sugar

1 cup quick oat 3/4 cup melted butter

6 oz. chocolate chips

1/2 cup chopped (coarse) nuts

3/4 cup caramel topping (purchased)

Three additional tablespoon flour

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Mix together the flour, salt, baking soda, brown sugar, quick oats and melted butter.

Press half of the mixture into the bottom of an 8" square pan. Bake 10 minutes and remove from oven.

Sprinkle chocolate chips and chopped nuts over the crust.

Put caramel topping mixed with 3T flour over chocolate chips and nuts. Put remaining crumb mixture on top.

#### September Mission Focus is Central Dauphin School District NutriPacks Program.

September is Hunger action month and we highlight and support the Central Dauphin NutriPacks program in its mission to alleviate hunger.

Nutripacks is an outreach of the Panther/ Ram Foundation. This program is dedicated to helping students lead healthier lives by providing nutritious food for children in need for each weekend of the school year. Currently 1 in 5 students in the CD school district is considered food insecure. Each school building in the district has a designated staff member as its Site Facilitator and the program depends on volunteers, partners and faith organizations to fulfill its mission.

Volunteers are always needed each week to help sort and pack the meal packages. Our financial contribution of \$200 will feed one child for the school year, \$600 will feed three and \$1,000 will feed five. For more information go to <u>cdsdnutripacks.org</u>.
